## *Reestablishing Connections for Mathematics Learning*



The 48<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of the Research Council on Mathematics Learning (RCML) will be held in **Denton, Texas, on February 25–27, 2021** at the **Embassy Suites by Hilton Denton Convention Center**. Connections are requisite to mathematics learning. However, building and sustaining connections among content, contexts, and circumstances remains a challenge in our everchanging society. Thus, this year’s conference theme is *reestablishing connections for mathematics learning*. The purpose of the conference is to share current research in mathematics education. Additionally, RCML publishes conference proceedings of selected papers that have been accepted as conference presentations. Acceptance of a proposal does not guarantee acceptance of the associated publication for the proceedings; however, all authors whose conference proposal has been accepted are invited to submit a paper based on their proposal. **Manuscripts proposed for the conference proceedings are due by October 31, 2020**. Before submitting your paper, please review the Proceedings Submission Guidelines on the [RCML website](http://www.rcml-math.org). Conference proposals and papers submitted to the *RCML Proceedings* are **peer reviewed**. The lead author on the proceedings paper *must* register for the conference. Join us in 2021 in Denton.
